MENTAL HEALTH

Compassionate mental health supportive services are provided for teens, including counseling and coping strategies. These services are offered in a safe and non-judgmental environment, empowering teens to navigate challenges & thrive.



TARGETED CASE MANAGEMENT

Assistance is provided in obtaining essential identification (e.g., SSN, birth certificate, and driver's license). Additionally, we offer help in applying for benefits and provide personalized employment planning for job readiness.



LIFE SKILLS WORKSHOPS

This program includes weekly workshop meetings aimed at supporting Transitional Aged Youth (TAY) in pursuing their educational and employment goals. Skills aid participants in transitioning into adulthood with a self-determined plan.



RESOURCES AND LINKAGES

We provide a wide array of resources and linkages for teens, including needs assessment, targeted case management, community resource connections, concrete support, social change initiatives, and suicide prevention education.
